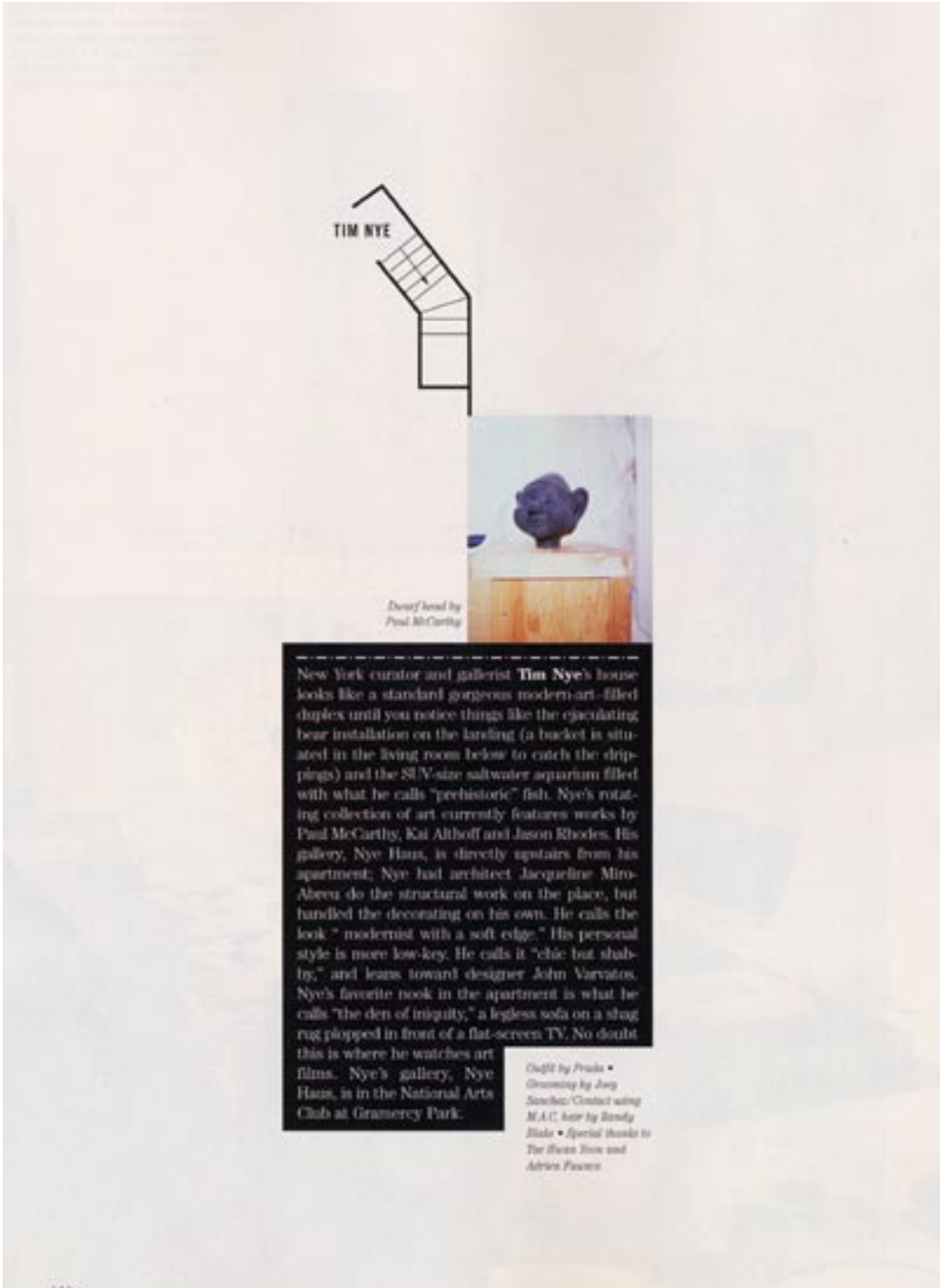

New York curator and gallerist **Tim Nye**'s house looks like a standard gorgeous modern-art-filled duplex until you notice things like the ejaculating bear installation on the landing (a bucket is situated in the living room below to catch the drippings) and the SUV-size saltwater aquarium filled with what he calls "prehistoric" fish. Nye's rotating collection of art currently features works by Paul McCarthy, Kai Althoff and Jason Rhodes. His gallery, Nye Haus, is directly upstairs from his apartment; Nye had architect Jacqueline Miro-Abeas do the structural work on the place, but handled the decorating on his own. He calls the look "modernist with a soft edge." His personal style is more low-key. He calls it "chic but shabby," and leans toward designer John Varvatos. Nye's favorite nook in the apartment is what he calls "the den of iniquity," a legless sofa on a shag rug plopped in front of a flat-screen TV. No doubt this is where he watches art films. Nye's gallery, Nye Haus, is in the National Arts Club at Gramercy Park.
